TRENDS

(taken from CAUT University Notes)

** Canada's GDP (Gross Domestic Product) increased by 25.2% between 1978-79 and 1986-87 in real terms

** During the same period, provincial operating grants have increased by 1.1% in real terms

** The number of students attending Canadian university has increased steadily, by 29.7%

** At the same time, the number of university teachers has increased by only 8.9%

SALARY SLICE OF THE BUDGETARY PIE

<u>Academic</u> salaries and wages as a percentage of operating expenditure decreased at Carleton from 39.33% in 1981/82 to 37.14% in 1987/88.

The total of <u>all</u> salaries and wages also decreased over the same period from 71.74% to 68.44%. Benefit costs have, however, risen from 8.51% to 9.36%. This increase in benefits was not enough to offset the decrease in salaries so that the total of salaries and benefits for employees at Carleton decreased from 80.25% to 77.80%.

Merit

a method of rewarding activities directed toward the new excellence

Important Work

that which will contribute directly to the university's ability to attract corporate, foundation or government monies. No longer related to work of general interest, creativity, originality or quality.

Outstanding

that which gains public recognition in areas which align the university with corporate or government interests

Centre of Excellence

a structure which centralizes and delivers the labour of those working on knowledge production over to the service of topical areas supported by market interests.

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE CORPUS CHRISTI COLLEGE

VISITING FELLOWSHIPS

Corpus Christi College has an annual program under which visiting scholars who may wish to spend from one term to a year in Cambridge are welcomed as Visiting Fellows to temporary membership of this College. Preference is given to distinguished scholars with several years of academic experience who have not previously been members of this University. Four fully furnished, centrally heated, 2 bedroom apartments are set aside for the occupation of such visitors at a reasonable rental.

Accommodation will be allocated on the basis of applications received before <u>October 1, 1989</u>. Six copies of the application which should include the following information: a full c.v., subject of study/research to be pursued in Cambridge; dates applicant proposes to be in Cambridge; whether married and to be accompanied by spouse and children; names and addresses of 2 referees for academic work and personal qualities who should be asked to write directly to the College Secretary before October 1, 1989; and some information about applicant's outside interests.

The housing cost is not yet fixed but is 91-97 pounds per week for 89/90 (includes central heating and hot water but not metered gas and electricity).

Visiting fellows are normally expected not to hold any appointment at or temporary membership of another Cambridge College during the tenure of their appointment at the College.
