## FACULTY EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Faculty members at Ontario universities and community colleges may take part in a new exchange program with Ontario's twin province, JIANGSU PROVINCE-CHINA. This program, funded by the Province of Ontario and administered by the University of Toronto-York University Joint Centre on Modern East Asia, will provide funding for Ontario faculty to study, do research or teach in the People's Republic of China. There are short or long-term exchanges. Faculty are encouraged to decide for themselves how much time is needed to complete their particular projects. In 1987, the equivalent of five person years of study will be awarded. Deadlines for application are October 15, 1986 for short-term and November 15 for long-term exchanges.
