The CUASA Steering Committee has set up a Sub-Committee to investigate the possibility of CUASA sponsoring workshops on Tenure and Promotion and for new Chairmen. The committee, comprised of David Cray (Past-President) and Pat Finn (Business Agent), has agreed to look into scheduling the Tenure/Promotion workshop at the end of September and the workshop for new Chairmen at the beginning of September in the few days between registration and the start of classes. For the Tenure/Promotion workshop we are considering a panel of individuals with expertise in the process, such as the Chair of the University Promotions Committee and the CUASA Grievance Chair. We hope that the workshop will explore both the process itself and assist members in the preparation of their documentation necessary for the process. The workshop for new Chairmen will be designed to enhance their knowledge of their duties and responsibilities as encompassed by the collective agreement.

It is possible that participation may have to be limited (due to the constraints of room size) and, in addition, we have no idea of the numbers of members who might be coming up for tenure or promotion.
