Exposing the Myth:

OUR SHARE OF THE PIE GETTING SMALLER

It is interesting to note the variance, over time, of the portion of the budget allocated to academic salaries. In CUASA's June 16, 1977 Negotiations Bulletin we reported the % of budget for 1975-6 was 37.8 and for 1976-7 it was 38.2. The latest OPAS statistics indicate the % of budget for academic salaries in 1989-90 was 37.93. A COU report indicates this line item across the Ontario system was running at 39.0%.

Province-wide analysis of Instruction and Research (I.&R.) Expenses per BIU indicates Carleton was second highest in 1983, but that had dropped to 12th (out of 15) by 1990. In 1983, Instruction and Research Expenses were 64.12% of the expenditure per BIU; in 1990 they accounted for 63.61% of the expenditure per BIU.

Casting this analysis on the basis of full-time equivalent (FTE) students, Carleton went from 7th

to 12th during the same period. Instruction and Research Expenses dropped from 64.12% of the expenditure per FTE to 63.61%.
